It could be a large change for an existing organization, product, or service. It can result in a forprofit or non-profit venture. Past big ideas have come from engineering, nursing, computer science and many other fields.

2023 Timeline

Eligibility

- Participants must be current full or part-time MNSU undergraduate or graduate students or recent alumni within two years of graduating. Open to any major.
- Teams may include 1 to 5 people and may include non-MNSU students as long as the team consists of at least 2/3 current students or recent alumni.
- Teams are no longer eligible to compete in the Big Ideas Challenge once they have won a cash prize. Teams may re-apply as many times as desired if they have not won a cash prize.
- Participants must follow rules and abide by all deadlines to remain eligible. At least one member of each team must attend both rehearsals.
- Participants agree that if they win first place, they will continue as a semifinalist in the Minnesota Cup.

Applicants will receive Big Ideas Challenge updates throughout the competition via email. Be sure to provide an email address that you check daily.

All participants have the option to receive individual consulting from the Small Business Development Center, faculty and other mentors to assist with developing their idea, plan and pitch.

Round 1 - Application

The first round consists of the business idea you put together and share using the <u>Slingshot webapp</u>. This round is blind judged online by multiple judges.

The CIE Team will not have access to your idea until your final website link is shared with us. You are welcome to create/build multiple ideas until your final idea is submitted. Once your business idea is complete, email your personal website link to: shane.bowyer@mnsu and ashley.niss.2@mnsu.edu by the deadline.

Round 2 - Business Plan

The six teams with the highest judging scores will become finalists and advance onto round 2 & 3 of the Big Ideas Challenge.

Finalists will submit a business plan to Ashley Niss and Shane Bowyer to be shared with our judging panel by the deadline.

Help available for finalists:

- Individual mentors assigned to each team to help with plan and pitch
- Free LivePlan business plan software (upon request)
- Free coaching sessions with Small Business Development Center for plans
- Get detailed feedback on your presentation
- Prototyping tools, coaching and support at the CIE

Round 3 - Pitch Presentation

For the event Day, November 16, teams will pitch their ideas in front of the judges and live audience, the audience will vote for the People's Choice award and the winners will be announced.

Expectations

The CIE Team holds the right to disqualify a team at a given time due to unprofessionalism. To comply with our guidelines, we expect the following:

- Teams must meet with their mentor(s) at least twice.
- Late applications, business plans, slide decks, etc. will not be accepted.
- Unless given timely notice, Teams are expected to be at all Big Ideas
 Challenge meetings and rehearsals.
- Other acts of unprofessionalism will be judged on a case-by-case bases.

Awards

Winners will be selected based on business plan and pitch scores (50% each).

<u>Awards</u>

- 1st Place & Minnesota Cup automatic semi-finalist
- 2nd Place
- 3rd Place
- People's Choice (live audience voting during live pitch event)

Winners pledge, if they are students, to remain in college until graduation or for one year after receipt of the prize funds. All winners agree to participate in the Big Ideas judging or live pitch event the following year.

Minnesota Cup

All participants are encouraged to apply for the Minnesota Cup competition in addition to Big Ideas. https://carlsonschool.umn.edu/mn-cup/

The winner of the general student competition of the Big Ideas Challenge will automatically move to the student semifinals in the Minnesota Cup (held the following October).

There are thousands of applications to the Minnesota Cup each year, so becoming an automatic semi-finalist is a tremendous boost toward that \$50,000 Student Division prize. By submitting your application to Big Ideas, you agree to participate in the Minnesota Cup, if you are selected as the first place competition winner.
